

The photographs of David Gethin and David Morgan have been transposed.







Nick Buckenham will be awarded a Royal Aero Club Diploma and Eric Marsh a Certificate of Merit.


The presentations by the Royal Aero Club will be in London on 23 April.


Financial report

Paul Brice gave the financial report.










There is approximately £44,000 of cash in the bank, including £30,000 on deposit with Scottish Widows.



Alan Cassidy presented the proposals for 2013.














HCO Review & plans

An incident had highlighted the fact that the Association's mobile phones are the most reliable method of communication. The contest management should always use them in preference to other communication methods.

Briefing times will be put back to facilitate arrival by air.

For the last two years, the judging school has been poorly attended. This year there will be a changed format to include video.

In future, the Instructors Day will run in alternate years. It will not be run in 2013.

The format of the Tiger will be changed, with two sequences run over two days. Pilots will be encouraged to organise themselves into teams of between 3 and 6 based on any common factor of their choice. It is hoped that pilots will find the experience of working in teams beneficial.

In spite of considerable efforts, it has not proved possible to find a venue to accommodate the power v glider event. Consequently, this event will be abandoned for the foreseeable future.

Finally, thanks are due to the people who have made the contests possible. Clive Hughes and the team at Compton Abbas for accepting rearranged events. There is no longer a need for a printed Contest Information Booklet. Julian Murfitt was responsible for the high quality of previous editions. Graham Hill is standing down from co-ordinating judges after many years of hard work. David Jenkins and Eric Marsh will jointly take on that task. It was planned to send teams to:


- World Advanced and Unlimited Glider Championships, Finland in July

- World Aerobatics Championships, Texas in October.


Election of directors

Ian Scott announced that there would be no change in rules for 2013. The training bursaries are based on the points trophy results.






Orange indicates a pilot who is eligible for a bursary. White indicates a reserve.

Judging matters

As previously mentioned, David Jenkins and Eric Marsh will jointly take on the role of co-ordinating the appointment of judges.

There have been a number of rule changes. These include radii on various figures at all levels. Advanced power now includes tail slides and negative flicks. Details will be on the website in due course. It is important to read the revised rules and highly desirable to attend the Judging School.

A series of lectures will be available for presentation at events during periods of adverse weather.





EASA and Aerobatics

Michael Corcoran was unable to attend due to bad weather but had circulated a paper in advance about gliding. There was hope of sensible grandfather rights but the BGA was still drafting its proposals to the CAA.

Alan Cassidy reported that the Aerobatic Rating was now available for power pilots and he recommended applying for the rating sooner rather than later.

Special resolution to change the Articles of Association

The resolution circulated in advance to change the Articles of Association to allow electronic communication with the members was passed by the required 75% majority.

Any Other Business

Members were reminded that an ordinary motor insurance policy will not cover them airside. It was suggested that volunteers are reminded of that at each event.
