

### Box



The judges will be placed to the SW of the tower building approx. 200m from the front centre of the box.

# Noise sensitive/avoid areas

The box is clear of any built-up areas, buildings and major public roadways. If you note unusual activity below you when entering the box, please advise the Chief Judge by radio and await further instruction.

Please avoid overflying the hamlet of Noneley immediately to the NE of the box and Burlton village which is to the NW. If you find yourself over built-up areas or to the South of runway 05/23 you must stop your sequence and reposition.

### Safety Frequency

Contact on this frequency should be initiated by the Chief Judge. Please listen out on the frequency once airborne and remain clear of the box until positive contact is established. If no contact is established, please land and report to the Contest Director for further instruction.

### **Safety radio Calls**

If the officials call <u>Box,Box,Box</u> you must immediately reposition to remain within the marked confines of the box above.

If the officials call <u>Break,Break,Break</u> you must immediately stop your sequence, return to straight and level erect flight and lookout for conflicting traffic. Relevant information may be passed to you by the officials.

If the officials call <u>Land,Land</u> you must immediately stop your sequence and prepare to land at the earliest safe opportunity. Relevant information may be passed to you by the officials.

### **Rules**

Compliance with the General Rules of British Aerobatics and our Code of Conduct is a prerequisite for participating in a contest at any level. Where CIVA Regulations are to be used to manage a category, this will be notified.

When you sign the declaration at the contest you are declaring that you are fit to participate and that your aircraft has been checked to be in a satisfactory condition. If at any time this changes you MUST notify the Contest Director and await clarification BEFORE any further contest flight.
